

L-280 FOLLOWERSHIP TO LEADERSHIP

Overview: This 24 hour training course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. The course combines two days of classroom instruction followed by a second day in the field with students working through a series of problem solving events in small teams (Field Leadership Assessment Course). Topics include leadership values and principles, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team cohesion factors, ethical decision making, and after action review techniques. Some course activities may be arduous in nature.

Objectives: Students will be exposed to multiple leadership styles
Students will be able to list fundamental leadership principles
Students will express their values and how those values affect decision-making
Students will assess their individual traits and motivation for entering into a leadership role

Prerequisites: Experience on incident assignments in operations or support functions.
Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service (L-180)
Satisfactory completion of pre-course work.
