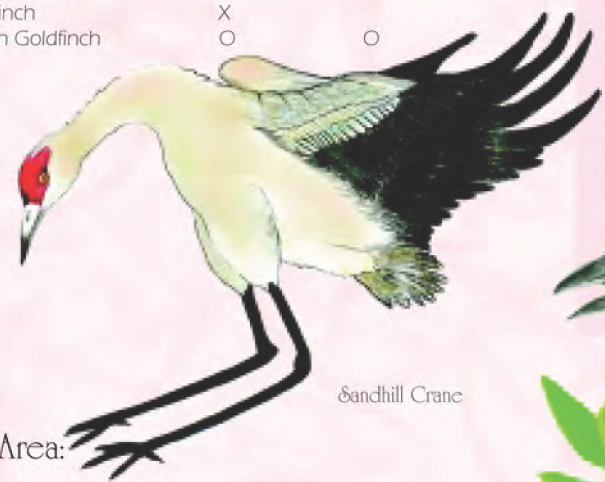

Seminole State Forest provides a boundless opportunity for birdwatchers. As part of the Wekiva River Basin the ecological diversity includes 13 natural communities, each containing unique flora and fauna. A few examples are flatwoods, scrub, blackwater streams and bottomland forests. Sand pine scrub provides habitat for the threatened Florida scrub jay. Other birds that make their home on Seminole State Forest include: sandhill crane, swallow-tailed kite, limpkin, osprey and snowy egret.

For birding opportunities on Seminole State Forest, the pastures near the main north parking area offer the chance to view sandhill cranes. At the intersection of Royal Trails Road and SR 44 is a wet weather pond where woodstorks have been spotted. Florida scrub jays can be seen at points along hiking trails, horse trails and designated open roads. At the south parking area, you are likely to see wading birds on Bear Pond. An occasional eagle, osprey or swallow-tailed kite may also be observed.

Seasons
These categories indicate the general periods in which to expect the various species.

Spring	(Sp)	March	April	May
Summer	(Su)	June	July	August
Fall	(F)	September	October	November
Winter	(W)	December	January	February

Categories of Abundance
These designations apply to the relative abundance of species seen (or heard) in the appropriate habitat.

- C- Common: Usually present in large numbers; likely to be seen.
- U- Uncommon: Usually present in small numbers; not certain to be seen or heard.
- O- Occasional: Seen only a few times during a season.
- R- Rare: Not to be expected, observed at intervals of 2-5 years.
- X- Accidental: Fewer than 5 records total; may apply to out-of-season records of “regular” species.
