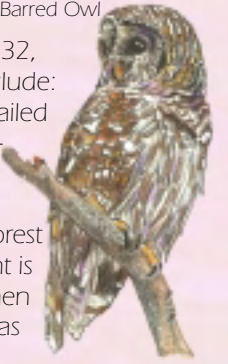

Welcome to Okaloacoochee Slough State Forest which is located in western Hendry and northeastern Collier counties. Though most of the forest provides excellent opportunities to observe a variety of birds, there are particular areas that attract specific species. The Okaloacoochee Slough includes a 13,382 acre swale that carries water through the forest to the north and south, and provides a haven for wading birds. The canal at the end of Oil Well Pad Road, and larger depressional marshes located on Patterson and Wildcow Roads, present excellent opportunities to see a number of birds including ibis, egrets and herons.

As you travel along County Road 832, raptors can be observed which include: crested caracara, kestrel, swallow-tailed kite, red-shouldered hawk and red-tailed hawk. Also, two large roosts can be observed along CR 832, approximately 1 mile west of the forest headquarters. This spectacular sight is best viewed at dawn and dusk when waterfowl and wading birds such as great blue heron, little blue heron, white ibis, glossy ibis, great egret and an occasional wood stork are taking flight or roosting.
